WHAT'S THE DIRT?

On the eastern coast of the United States, southern states encountered extra particles in the air dur to a large dust plume that traveled 5000 miles over the Atlantic Ocean from its origins in the Sahara Desert.

NASA-NOAA's Suomi NPP satellite observed a huge Saharan dust plume streaming over the North Atlantic Ocean, beginning on June 13. Satellite data showed the dust had spread over 2,000 miles.



On June 18, 2020, NASA-NOAA's Suomi NPP satellite captured this visible image of the large light brown plume of Saharan dust over the North Atlantic Ocean. Normally, hundreds of millions of tons of dust are picked up from the deserts of Africa and blown across the Atlantic Ocean each year. That dust helps build beaches in the Caribbean and fertilizes soils in the Amazon. It can also affect air quality in North and South America.

NASA continues to study the role of African dust in tropical cyclone formation.

Learners from different grades are allowed excess to the computer room to search for interesting articles online that they can read out loud to the rest of their class or at the weekly assembly. Learners unknowingly have been reading hundreds of stories as they enjoyed searching for the perfect story.


