WE HAVE SOME NEW COMPUTER LABS!

In mid-August, we approved three new computer labs and we're happy to share them with you... We are excited to call them partners and hope to get their computers shipped in the next week. Feel free to click on their logo for more information about their organization!

GIZZIM ORGANIZATION—They are located in Ruiru, Kenya. Gizzim is a network of photographers working with under-resourced young people to offer photography skills. Their photography curriculum combines the visual storytelling with digital application to equip students. They are sponsored by the Canon Camera Company. They plan to download photography editing software on the laptops to teach students editing as well as computer skills. They look forward to empowering their beneficiaries with relevant computer skills.



PCEA AHADI ZETU KIANGAI CENTER—This computer lab is a collaboration between a local church, PCEA Kiangai, and Ahadi Zetu, a USA-based nonprofit whose founder, Wanja Ogongi (and now a Board member of Connection Ubuntu), grew up in this community. They are located in Kiangai, Kenya. Their goal with the computer center is to empower both youth and adult learners with essential computer skills. They understand that in this increasingly connected world, digital literacy is a necessity. They will provide a safe space for students to learn skills and connect with the world and hope to open doors to further/higher education, employment and personal growth. Additionally, Ahadi Zetu would like to use the center to provide a variety of life skills and mental health workshops virtually to young adults and community members, if possible, by partnering with schools of social work and clinicians in the USA.




ROY NDUNG'U FOUNDATION—Located in Kikuyu Town, Kenya, this organization works mostly with young women and mothers who form a majority of the caregivers of people with disabilities and progressive conditions. These mothers and women often can't go to a working job because of the costs of hiring a full-time caregiver. The digital skills gained through training using the computers from the lab will allow these women to learn skills they can use to generate income even without being employed.



OUR GHANA LAB LEARNS MICROSOFT PAINT

"The students of Kukurantumi RC JHS in Ghana have greatly benefited from the ICT Laboratory established by Connection Ubuntu through Rescue Wing International. As part of our national curriculum in Ghana, learners are required to learn Microsoft Office Word and Paint. The girls were guided through a practical session on how to design the Ghana flag using the drawing tools in MS Word. They were delighted to select shapes to create the outline of the flag and later used the shape fill tab to add vibrant colors, making the flag colorful.

They were also introduced to MS Paint, where they practiced drawing and coloring various shapes. With the help of the MS Paint app, the girls designed and colored the Ghana flag, further enhancing their creative and technical skills. The students were thrilled to engage in these hands-on activities, gaining valuable experience in digital design. We're so
